

Practical application

When using Scopus as a researcher, it becomes possible to

- Uncover important and relevant articles that you may otherwise miss
- Use the analyze tools to find the best journal in your field (to publish in)
- Check out the work and citations of other authors
- Find out who is citing you, and how many citations an article or an author has received
- Analyze citations for a particular journal issue, volume or year
- Use the refine results overview to quickly see the main journals, disciplines and authors that publish in your area of interest.
- Click on the cited by and reference links to track research trends and make connections.

Scopus user rights

To access the Scopus database, initial registration at <http://www.scopus.com> is required. To get full access, one needs to become an authorized user by subscribing to Licensed Products.

NB: As a student of Southern Federal University, you can get full access to the Scopus website when using computer terminals within the library facilities at the Institutions or the University premises **only**. Remote access is allowed through the University's secure network.

As an authorized user, one can

- access, search, view and browse the licensed products
- print and electronically save for personal use a reasonable amount of articles, abstracts, records or parts of chapters
- provide printed or electronic copies of excerpts to other authorized users or to third party colleagues for their scholarly or research use

One cannot

- abridge, modify, translate or create any derivative work based on the licensed products without the due permission
- remove, obscure or modify copyright notices, other notices or disclaimers as they appear in the licensed products
- substantially or systematically reproduce, retain or redistribute the licensed products

Unauthorized use of the licensed products may lead to suspension of access to the licensed products.
